Description				
<p>The primary objectives of this remodel were to provide this bath with much needed updating, and make it easy to use for the owners' grandchildren when they were visiting. It needed to function as a pool bath as well as a traditional bath with a tub. The original bath had outdated red, white, and blue tile, as well as a very deep cylindrical tub that had been sunken to almost floor level.</p> <p>The solution was to continue the same tile used in other parts of the home into this bathroom. A small border of glass tile is similar to that used in the master bath. The clean lined shaker style cabinetry is also found in other parts of the home. The granite top is from the same slab as the master bath as well.</p> <p>The separate shower and tub were combined into a single tub shower, with a space saving bi-fold shower door that is unobtrusive, sleek and easy to use. A large shelf at one end of the tub can hold all types of tub toys or bathing accessories. As it folds into itself when not in use, the room appears larger and more comfortable.</p> <p>The cabinetry was treated with a free standing furniture look, making the room feel more spacious. A small 18" deep linen tower was tucked behind the entry door where a hot water heater had been located. The new water heater, relocated to a hall closet, is a sleek tankless model that affords guests never run out of hot water when visiting.</p>
